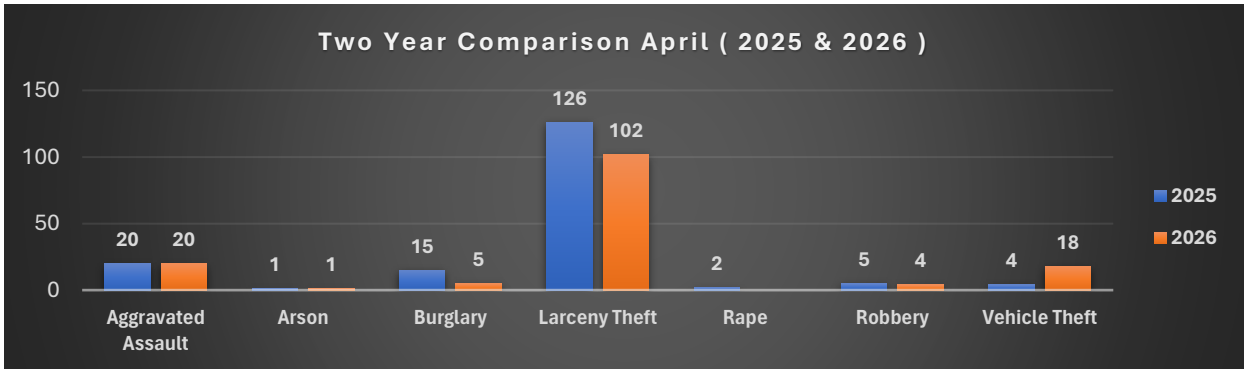
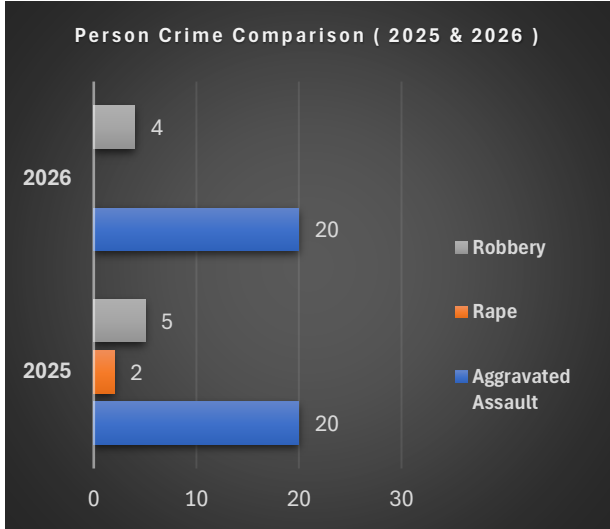
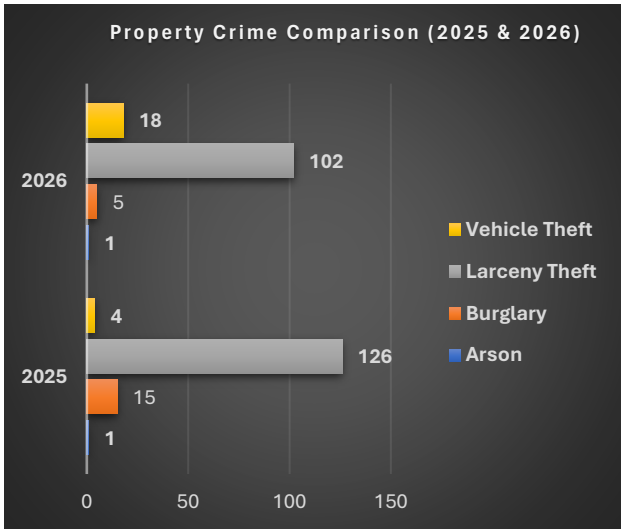

Two Year Data Comparison For April (2025 & 2026)

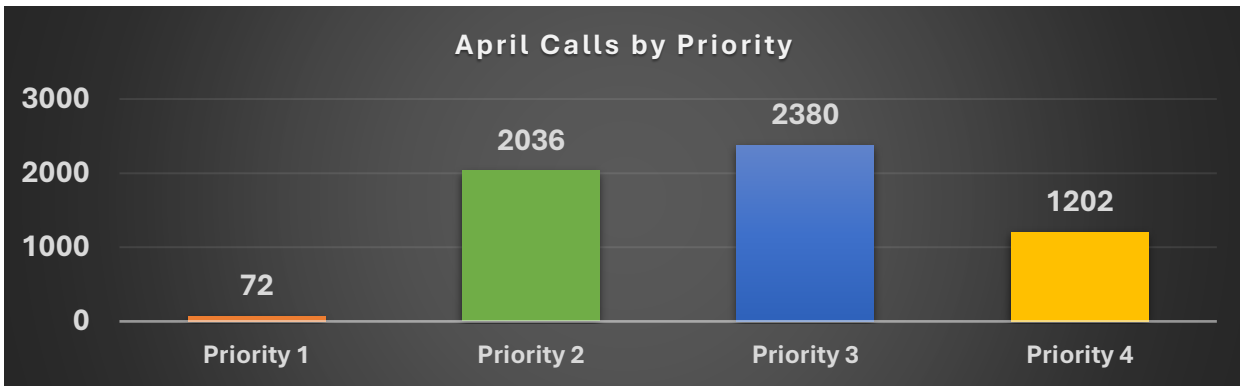

Priority 1: Involved circumstances that pose, or did pose in the immediate past, a clearly defined threat to human life or property, and which involve a high level of violence or the potential for serious injury.

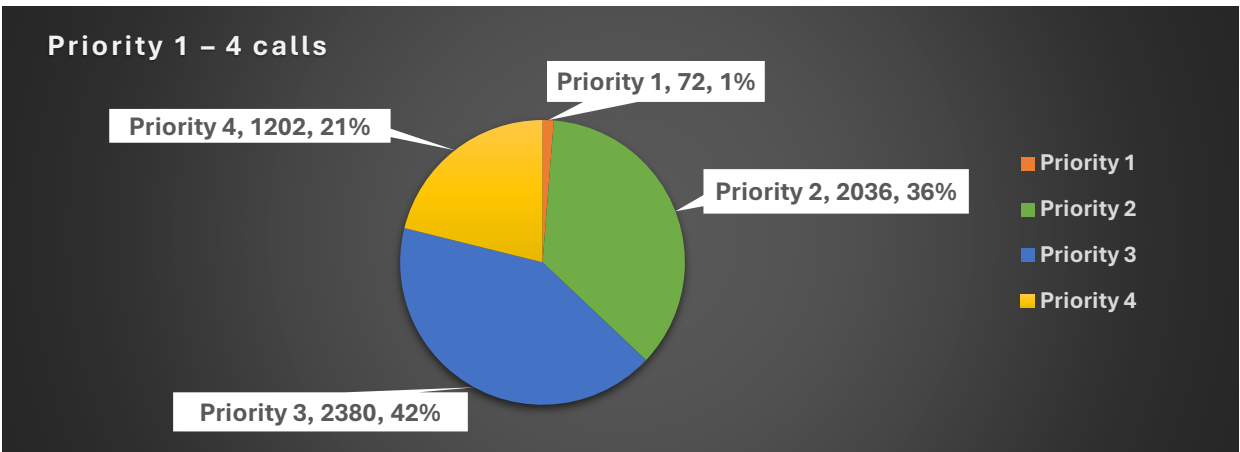
Priority 2: Involve circumstances of an urgent, but not life-threatening nature. They are generally disturbances with a potential for violence, minor assaults and batteries, etc.

Priority 3: Involve circumstances that are neither urgent nor life-threatening.

Priority 4: Except for a few felonies, most past incidents are classified as Priority 4.

Priority 5 & 9: Those calls meeting the criteria for Code 5 & Patrol calls (NOT SHOWN).

Notable Cases

04/06/26 - Investigators were called out to assist patrol deputies with a school violence threat. A local preschool was threatened by phone by an unknown suspect. Through collaboration with other investigators, the threats were determined to be made by a suspect in Florida. The suspect was identified and arrested by law enforcement in Florida. Case agents: Investigator Gasparini.

4/9/2026 – Investigators were called out to assist patrol deputies with an investigation of a defrauded vehicle sale involving a suspect with a stolen identity. The investigation revealed that a suspect, Brittany Ball, stole a victim's identity and used the stolen identity to obtain a vehicle from a local business. The defrauded vehicle was recovered. The suspect was booked into jail for identity theft charges. Case agents: Investigator Mills and Corporal Au. TE260990071

4/18/26 - Investigators were called out to assist in a missing 78-year-old male case. A resident went missing, which prompted a Silver Alert. The investigators located the subject in the city of Hemet, and he was safe. Case Agents: Master Investigator Marquez and Deputy Risen.

04/27/26 - Investigators were called out to assist in a missing 12-year-old juvenile case. A local juvenile went missing, which prompted an Ebony Alert. During the follow-up investigation, the juvenile returned home and was safe. Case Agents: Investigator Oxley

Notable Cases

In January, a suspicious death occurred in the City of Temecula, possibly an overdose death. The Overdose Death Investigation & Narcotics Unit responded and analyzed the victim's phone. SET assisted, and an investigation resulted in a possible subject who sold the victim cocaine days before she passed. In April, probable cause was established to pursue a search warrant at the subject's residence. SET & METRO conducted the search warrant. They located an indoor marijuana grow and seized firearms, over 60 grams of cocaine, illegal fireworks, and miscellaneous narcotics.

The following suspects were arrested for multiple narcotics charges:

Michael Del Campo (Menifee resident), Robert Del Campo (Menifee resident), and Angelina Hughes (Temecula resident).

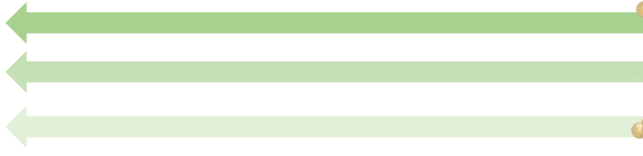
