PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:

- DEM attended a 2-day Grant Management Course hosted by Riverside County Sheriff.
- DEM and the Temecula Citizen Corps participated in the Annual CERT Field Day hosted by the City of Riverside. There were over 120 CERT Members who participated in the event.
- DEM and the Human Resources Department launched the City's new Disaster Service Worker Training Program on the 15th June.
- DEM commissioned the TCC's new HAM Radio Team on the 15th of June. The goal of this program is to
 have a cadre of additional emergency communicators to assist the City in times of emergency.
- Temecula has changed their Alert & Warning Program provider to RAVE Mobile Systems in a cooperative program with CalOES.
- DEM hosted an informal presentation at the Pechanga Resort Casino to discuss Emergency
 Management Response Strategies to Mass Shootings. The presentation was conducted in
 collaboration with the Pechanga Fire Department and Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department.
