**SUBJECT:** Approve the Purchase of Four (4) Police BMW RT-P Motorcycles from Long Beach BMW

**RECOMMENDATION:** That the City Council approve the purchase of four (4) Police BMW RT-P motorcycles from Long Beach BMW for a total cost of \$163,130.80.

**BACKGROUND:** The City of Temecula contracts with the County of Riverside to provide law enforcement services through the Riverside County Sheriff's Department. Under this agreement, the City is responsible for furnishing and maintaining vehicles and equipment necessary to support law enforcement operations within Temecula.

To ensure reliability, safety, and operational efficiency, the Sheriff Motor Unit periodically replaces motorcycles that have reached the end of their service life. The Department has identified the need to replace four motorcycles that are no longer cost-effective to maintain or suitable for continued deployment.

To obtain the best value and expedite the procurement process, staff recommends purchasing the replacement motorcycles using the pricing and terms established through the City of San Bernardino's competitively awarded contract (RFQ F-25-4043) with Long Beach BMW Motorcycles. The City of San Bernardino conducted a formal, competitive solicitation for current-production BMW 1300 RT-P Police Motorcycles and awarded a Goods Purchase Agreement to Long Beach BMW on June 25, 2025.

The attached quote from Long Beach BMW provides a unit cost of \$40,782.70 per motorcycle, for a total purchase price of \$163,130.80 for four vehicles, inclusive of taxes and applicable fees. Each motorcycle is a BMW 1300 RT-P equipped with the U.S. Authority Package, including emergency lighting, siren systems, communications interface, and readiness for installation of agency-provided radios. The purchase includes a two-year warranty covering parts and workmanship.

This procurement approach is authorized under Temecula Municipal Code § 3.28.290(E), which provides an exception to formal bidding when “any agreement involving acquisition of supplies, equipment or services [is] entered into with another governmental entity”. By utilizing the pricing from another public agency’s competitively awarded contract, the City can secure high-quality, law-enforcement-ready motorcycles while maintaining full compliance with municipal purchasing requirements.

This method provides significant value to the City by ensuring access to competitive pricing established through a recent public bidding process, reducing staff time and administrative costs associated with issuing a separate solicitation, and maintaining transparency and compliance with local purchasing policies. It also allows timely replacement of essential fleet equipment critical to the continued delivery of public-safety services. By leveraging another agency’s competitively awarded contract, the City achieves best value while maintaining consistency with procurement standards and ensuring operational readiness for its law enforcement operations.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** Adequate funding for the purchase of four new Sheriff motorcycles is included in the Fiscal Year 2025-26 Adopted Budget, which provides \$192,000 in appropriations for Sheriff vehicle replacements. The total purchase cost of \$163,130.80 is within the approved budget and includes all applicable taxes and fees.
