Two Year Data Comparison For October (2024 & 2025)



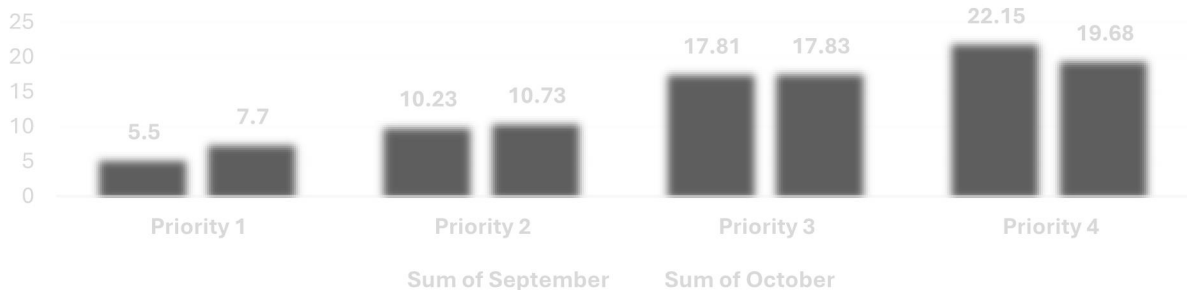

Priority 1: Involved circumstances that pose, or did pose in the immediate past, a clearly defined threat to human life or property, and which involve a high level of violence or the potential for serious injury.

Priority 2: Involve circumstances of an urgent, but not life-threatening nature. They are generally disturbances with a potential for violence, minor assaults and batteries, etc.

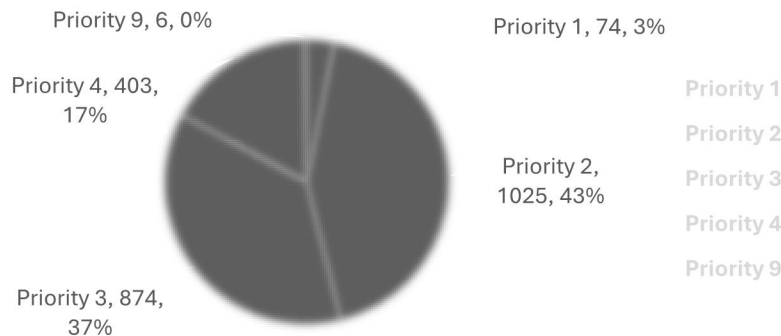
Priority 3: Involve circumstances that are neither urgent nor life-threatening.

Priority 4: Except for a few felonies, most past incidents are classified as Priority 4.

Priority 9: Those calls meeting the criteria for processing by the Telephone Report Unit (TRU).

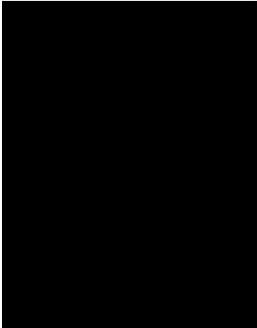

Investigators executed a search warrant at his apartment, where computer equipment was seized as evidence. **Lashley was arrested for possession of sexual abuse material.**

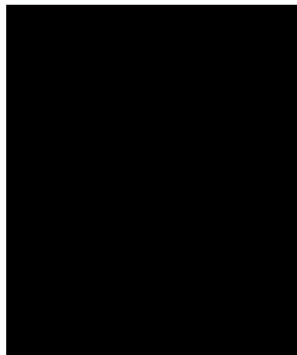

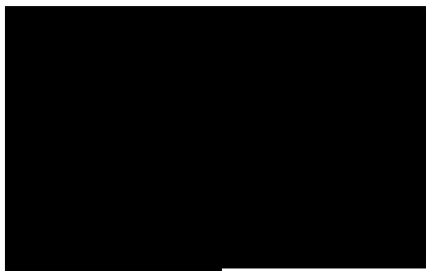

On 10/30, SET gathered intel of a known drug dealer, June Alejo, staying at the Motel 6 in Old Town Temecula. SET observed her leave the motel and conducted a stop. June was on parole for possession of ammunition. Monique Aguirre was a passenger. SET & RCT conducted a parole compliance check of June's room. Deputies located nearly half a pound of methamphetamine, about an ounce of fentanyl, drug paraphernalia, and items indicative of sales. Aguirre claimed the drugs belonged to her, and additional drugs were found in her possession. **She was arrested for drug-related offenses.**

On 10/08, SET received information that Alexander Leroy was involved in narcotics sales. It was learned he had a felony warrant for probation violation and narcotics offenses, and that he was staying at the Quality Inn in Temecula. SET observed Leroy leaving the room and meeting with another HS user, Denise Stewart. Both Leroy and Stewart were found to have narcotics on their person. Another subject, Rafael Cortez, another known HS user, was seen leaving the hotel room. He was arrested for an outstanding warrant and possession of fentanyl and drug paraphernalia. **All three were arrested for various charges, and multiple narcotics were seized.**

On 10/09, a search warrant was executed at his residence. They observed Andrews leave the residence, and they initiated a stop. **He was arrested for multiple burglary and theft charges.**
