A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
TEMECULA ADOPTING A TITLE VI PLAN AND PROGRAM
PURSUANT TO TITLE VI OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF
1964 RELATED TO FEDERAL FUNDING FOR CITY
SERVICES, PROGRAMS, AND PROJECTS

BACKGROUND: Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Title VI) is a federal law that requires no person in the United States, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to, discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance. The Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1973 added the requirement that there be no discrimination on the basis of sex. Title VI applies to recipients and sub-recipients of federal financial assistance. The Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 makes clear that pursuant to Title VI, discrimination is prohibited throughout any department of a local agency that accepts federal financial assistance. The City periodically receives federal funding from the Federal Highway Administration and other federal programs. As a recipient of such federal aid, the City is required to comply with Title VI and related Department of Transportation regulations (Title 49 CFR Part 21). The attached Title VI Program and Plan was developed to guide the City in its administration and management of Title VI related activities pursuant to law.

It is recommended that the City Council approve the resolution adopting a Title VI Plan and Program for the City of Temecula.
