SUBJECT: Approve Recommendation for Community Service Funding Grant Program for Fiscal Year 2025-26 (At the Request of Subcommittee Members Kalfus and Schwank)

RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council approve recommendation to allocate a total of \$77,500 to fund grant applications received from nonprofit organizations for the Community Service Funding Grant Program Fiscal Year 2025-26.

BACKGROUND: The City Council appointed Mayor Brenden Kalfus and Council Member Zak Schwank to the Fiscal Year 2025-26 Community Service Funding Ad Hoc Subcommittee. This Ad Hoc Subcommittee reviews applications from nonprofit organizations requesting grant funding through the City's annual Community Service Funding Grant Program, and makes recommendations for programs that support residents within the City of Temecula.

The Fiscal Year 2025-26 Community Service Funding Grant Program has an adopted budget of \$90,000 with available grants up to \$5,000 per nonprofit organization. Information about the grant program was emailed to nonprofit organizations within the Temecula Valley area to include community-based charities in the City's database. Additionally, promotional advertisements were shared across the City's social media platforms. The application form and guidelines were also published on the City's website and remain publicly accessible at TemeculaCA.gov/grants.

The City received 48 applications from nonprofit organizations requesting a combined total of \$237,500 in grant funding. The Ad Hoc Subcommittee evaluated all of the applications based on criteria established by the City Council, prioritizing charitable community-wide programs that benefit Temecula residents with services such as food, clothing, shelter, medical care, school supplies and support for youth programs, healthcare-related needs, family and elderly care, underprivileged students, individuals with disabilities, domestic violence victims, veterans, and similar initiatives. Twenty-two programs are recommended to receive a grant ranging from \$2,500 to \$5,000, totaling an allocation of \$77,500.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funds in the amount of \$77,500 are available in the Fiscal Year 2025-26 Community Service Funding line item 001.101.999.5267.
