



Course Title: Narcan Training for City of Temecula Employees

Course Description:

In partnership with CalFire, Riverside County Sheriff's Office (RSO), and Riverside University Health Systems (RUHS), the City of Temecula designed this course to equip employees with the knowledge and skills needed to recognize and respond to an opioid overdose, including the proper administration of naloxone (Narcan) to reverse the effects of an overdose. Participants will learn how opioids affect the body, the signs and symptoms of an opioid overdose, and step-by-step Instructions for administering Narcan safely and effectively.

This course will also cover the Good Samaritan Law, which provides legal protection for individuals who assist in an overdose emergency. By the end of this training, participants will feel confident in their ability to take life-saving action while understanding their rights and responsibilities under the law.

Learning Objectives:

- Understand the impact of opioids and the risk of overdose
- Identify the signs of an opioid overdose
- Learn how to administer naloxone (Narcan) properly
- Recognize the importance of calling emergency services
- Gain awareness of the Good Samaritan Law and its legal protections
