Where We Have Been Temecula grew from a small bedroom community to a regional center in its first 20 years, all the while maintaining a highly valued quality of life for its nearly 110,000 residents. Over the twelve years since the first QLMP was adopted, a number of systems have been put in place to protect and enhance the investments that were made during the City's early years. The QLMP has been incorporated into the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) budget and its Annual Operating Budget (AOB). Increasingly, the focus is to ensure that the City is able to maintain the highest quality of services for its residents and that it is building its resiliency against all types of potential future disruptions, including economic, health, and natural disasters.
